Academic Program

Using a semester schedule, MCC delivers a comprehensive college preparatory curriculum comprised of over 100 courses in 10 academic areas and includes 18 AP courses and 27 honors courses. Please note that scheduling constraints may impact the number of AP courses that a student can take.

Students must earn 24 credits to graduate, including the following requirements: Theology (4), English (4), Mathematics (4), Science (3), Social Studies (3), World Language (2), Physical Education (1), Fine/Practical Arts (1), and Electives. By graduation, a large majority of seniors exceed the above requirements. Students complete a minimum of seven credits yearly.

MCC does not rank students.

Course Weighting/Diploma Options

Honors Courses earn a .50 quality point added to the grade point average. Advanced Placement, Florida Tech and Barry University courses have a 1.0 quality point added to the grade point average. Currently, MCC offers three diploma options – honors, college prep and standard.
